

Fouhse in Focus



Long-time Ottawa Magazine contributor Tony Fouhse takes a break from magazine work to display what he calls his "research and development"—images, like this one called A Batman, taken during road trips around Canada and the U.S. They get his brain working and help him develop that distinct style. Fouhse is known for shooting images with a quirky quality, and readers will recognize his signature (he has shot a number of OM covers, including newsman Max Keeping and restaurateur Alfie Friedman). With a salty tongue that spares no one, the photographer can disarm the stodgiest of politicians in time for that perfect shot. Fouhse highlights his subjects' idiosyncrasies, giving them a more human quality. Tony Fouhse has two exhibitions showing concurrently at Gallery 101 (236 Nepean St., 230-2799) from April 6 to May 6, and at La Petite Mort Gallery (306 Cumberland St., 860-1555) from April 7 to May 4.
